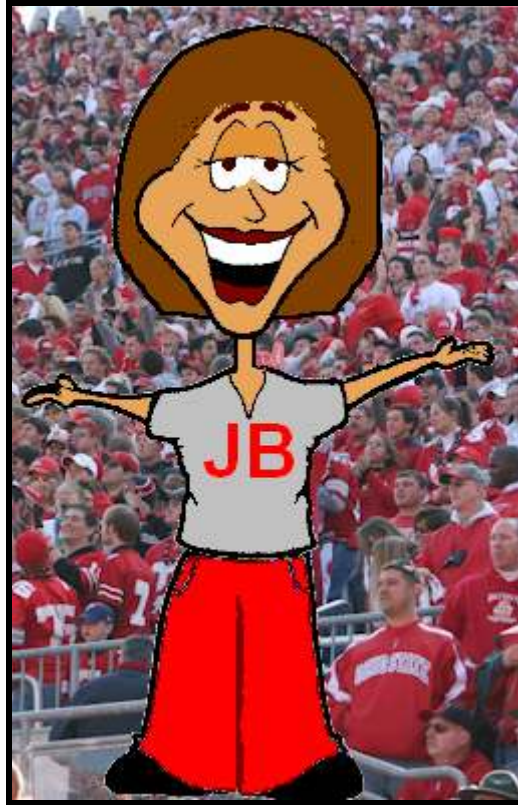


JENNY BUCKS

I'm selecting D - both A and B - out of optimism.

I thought Boeckman showed great poise and was clearly Bucks' #1 QB. I'm not sure Schoenhof is #2 but perhaps Henton. I loved the velocity in the balls thrown by Henton.

And of the RB's - was the time missed by Beanie due to injury problems this fall really to blame or is Brandon Saine truly the #1 back out there (but for his poor blocking that about cost Boeckman his head on one sack play). Dunno. Remains to be seen and perhaps not till the road game with UW will we know.

But I liked the intensity on defense and poor Lawrence Wilson. His motor was running but an apparent broken leg or ankle (I've heard both) will likely keep him out of the lineup 6-8 weeks and possibly result in a medical redshirt season.

All day you needed to continue to refer to your program to get down all the new numbers, number changes, and new names. By the end of the half, I just about had it down ... then more faces on defense, particularly. And good play from a lot of the newcomers - Saine, Heyward, Washington, Sanzenbacher, Torrence, et. al. I think we will have a young team that probably benefits from this early "preseason" against some of the Ohio colleges.

And a new star in the receiving corps was found - gone are Ginn and Gonzo but I don't think anyone was surprised to see Robiske step right in and fill in capably for those who had gone before him. His skills shone brighter than anyone's out on the field yesterday ... yes, he had about a 6" advantage over the typical YSU defender but his speed was also devastating to the Penguin defense. I'd expect that he's going to draw quite a bit of attention from coaches the rest of the season ... too bad ESPiN didn't give him his due ... were he not taken out of the game to give his fellow receivers some reps, he was on course to break the David Boston single game record. As it was, he showed great skills, athleticism, et. al. vs. a I-AA team, a division of football no one will take lightly again.
